OUR POSITION

Becoming a parent at a young age brings some real challenges but with the right support teenager parents can achieve good outcomes. There are important steps we can take to provide greater support, choice and opportunity for teenage mothers and fathers.

OUR GOAL

We need to build more deliberate connections to make better use of current resources and to provide teenage parents with supported alternatives that build on their aspirations. For any interventions to be effective, they need to work across the current influences in their lives, including with family and whānau.

COMMISSION'S VIEW

- > Life can be tough for teen parents, but with the right pathways and support they can do a great job.
- The support and services available to teen parents provide opportunities to invest in future generations.
- New Zealand has many elements of an effective system of support for teen parents, but there are some gaps.
- To better support teen parents we need a stronger emphasis on providing:
 - intensive support for transition to further education, training and employment
 - relationship education and ongoing contraceptive advice for two years after the birth
 - > culturally appropriate support for Māori teen parents
 - well-connected networks focused specifically on helping teen parents
 - accessible support for teen fathers that engages them in parenting.
